

PHILOSOPHY OF PRAGMATIC LANGUAGE AND INFORMATION SCIENCE

Description

In the present sociotechnical and multicultural environments, configured recently by virtual interactive platforms, information research is subject to conditions that lead to the daily use of language. Thus, we propose the amplification of the gnoseological matrix of information science leading to a pragmatic perspective of the philosophy of language that discusses the understanding of language signification by means of its social usage. From this standpoint, we rethink concomitantly, information search without the exclusive use of systemic environments, and the repositioning of the person in information actions. From analyses about the processes of the construction of meaning of language and communication suggested by various theorists, we recognize that interactivity, as processes of collaboration and cooperation that establish themselves among intersubjects by the daily use of language, would truly be the validation conditions of virtual information actions.
